

## Utah Sexual Assault Statistics

- The only violent crime for which Utah's rate is above the national average is rape (39.9 forcible rapes per 100,000 people).
- Since only 9.8% of victims report rape to law enforcement, Utah may have experienced upwards of 9,000 rapes during 2005.

## Uniform Crime Data

### UCR Data

**Number of victims recorded 2005: 920**

Forcible rape is defined by the FBI as "the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults and attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included; however, statutory rape (without force) and other sex offenses are excluded". This definition of rape is extremely limited, excluding male victims of sexual assault, incidents where physical force was not used, victims raped by family members, and only counting victims of vaginal/penile penetration
